

MIE Maintenance Quick Start Guide

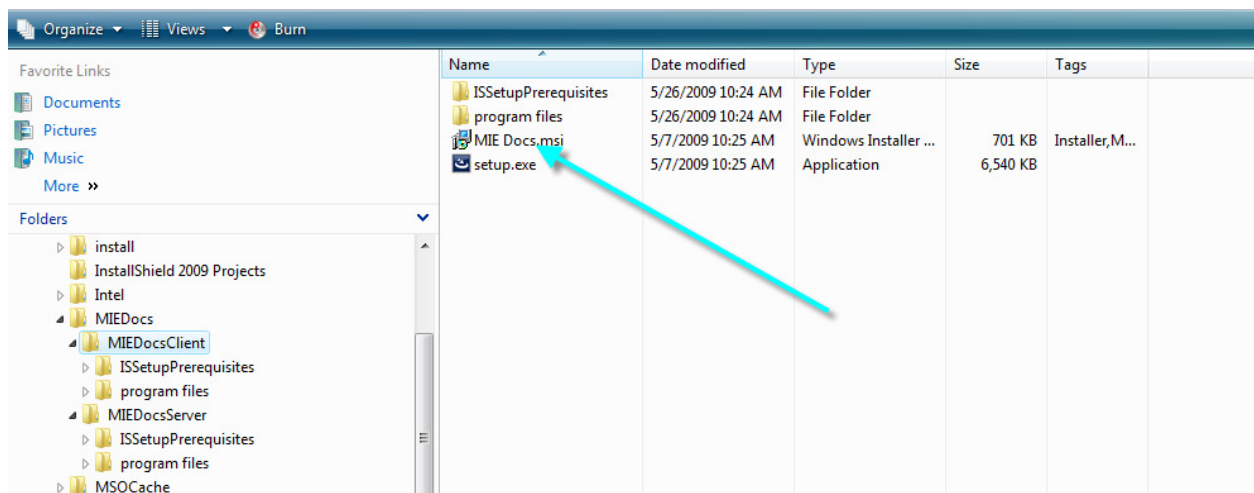
The following quick start guide is here to give you a high level overview on the installation process. This installation process is the same for both for an update or a new installation. During an update installation you will be able to skip step 2 installing SQL Server.

STEP 1 : DOWNLOAD FILES

On the MIE Solutions website you can download the files required for installation at the following website address. Uncompress the files using a compatible ZIP compression program into separate directories. Each installation directory will have a setup.exe that needs to be run.

You can download SQL Server express if you do not have SQL Server installed on your computer or network.

STEP 2 : INSTALL SQL SERVER

If you already have SQL Server installed you can skip to Step 3. You must install SQL server to begin using MIE Maintenance using the link shown above. You can install either SQL Express 2005 or SQL Express 2008. Please look at the installation instructions for more information.

STEP 3 : INSTALL MIE MAINTENANCE

The MIE Docs client application needs to be installed on each computer that you will grant access to the MIE Maintenance system. You can install the setup files on the network which gives all the clients access to running the setup application. Please look at the installation instructions for more information.

If you are installing clients you do not need to run the 'update database' task during the installation, this is only required during new or update installations one time, not for each client.

STEP 5 : START USING MIE MAINTENANCE

You can now click on the MIE Maintenance Icon to begin using the software to manage all your maintenance tasks.


